Dear parents and families,

As the weather is getting warmer now, please remember to apply sunscreen to your child's face and body prior to coming to Pumpkin. Due to the warm weather, we have started our summer routine which means we go outside earlier and come back in earlier also.

Children are required to wear sun safe hats that protect their face, neck and ears. Please bring in:

- bucket hat with a deep crown and brim size of at least 5cm.
- broad brimmed hat with a brim size of at least 6cm.
- Please note: Baseball caps or visors are not sun safe because they do not provide enough sun protection.

When outdoors, children will wear sun safe clothing that covers as much of the skin (especially the shoulders, back and stomach) as possible. This includes wearing:

- loose fitting shirts and dresses with sleeves and collars or covered neckline.
- knee-length or longer style skirts, shorts and trousers.
- clothing that is made from cool, densely woven fabric.
- clothing with high UV protection factors (UPF), at least UPF15 but preferably UPF 50.
- Please note: Midriff, crop or singlet tops are not sun safe because they do not provide enough sun protection.

Early literacy





The children's interest in book reading has been going very strong! They always reach out for books in the book corners, flipped each page and felt the texture of the books. Educators extended their interest by reading with them, singing, and explaining what was happening in the book. Moreover, we offered writing supplies such as crayons, pencils, and chalks for them to express their ideas and make meaning. They also have been exploring the alphabet letters with educators through song and magnetic letters!




through a craft experience, to be further used in their great imaginative

play. The families were then invited to share special photos. We got to see Ava climbing and having




fun at a birthday party, Maisie's Father's Day activity, Alicia's time visiting Christian, Darius' strawberry picking exprience at Port






Dancing and music! - On the 3rd, there



Miss Sinni found a snail in our playground one morning and called the children over. Everyone wanted to take a close look! Some children decided to spend most of their morning there, watching the snail closely. Miss Alex joined them

and together they noticed the snail's features, such as its' eyes,

its' shell and how slowly it was moving. Miss Alex then spotted a small snail in the bin. The children rushed to look and immediately noticed that it was a much smaller snail. Miss Sinni placed it close to other snail and it was wonderful to observe the bigger snail going inside its' shell while the smaller one kept exploring! On the 23^{rd} ,

the interest continued as we all went on a snail hunt after not being able to find any easily. Upon finding the snails, the

children continue to explore them further by observing and talking about what they could see. Later, the children had the opportunity to join a group where they watched an informative clip with many snail facts! The next day, the children

continued exploring the snails, this time closer with magnifying glasses! They also observed a snail from all angles through a





bug catcher jar! The snail interest continued strong until the end of the month. It was so much fun to explore many snails found in our gardens (on the 29th) as they were very active, crawling on each other, 'hugging' and trying to move into empty shells. The children also had the opportunity to engage in a snail craft experience!

The Jellyfish children also continued to show their growing appreciation and care towards their environment on the 22nd. Miss Sinni modelled them how to look after the garden by collecting all the leaves on the ground and the children followed Miss Sinni, they excitedly picked up the leaves. Hazel then initiated to water the garden, she reached out to Miss Sinni and asked for water. Some of her peers joined in. They took the water cans and waited for their turn to get the water. During watering, we spotted the snails again, the group showed their enthusiasm observing the snails again!




will look like once complete. Some suggestions have been a swimming pool and even a large sandpit. This has led to the Starfish and Lionfish

creating their own constructions sites which was extended through creating their own road and construction site signs. The Starfish and Lionfish also pretended using hammers to fix items and stating that they want to be builders when they grow up.



Sandpit... This month the sandpit has had a growing interest. While in the sandpit the Starfish and Lionfish have been observed expressing their imagination and creativity.



The Starfish and Lionfish have also requested to have the larger trucks in the sandpit too.



Pirates and Treasure... Leading on from the Starfish and Lionfish finding treasure in the sandpit and the interest in pirates we have had countless treasure hunts



using coins. These hunts have both been in the sandpit and within the learning environment. This has led to the Starfish and Lionfish counting how many coins they have and comparing if it is more or less then peers. This was once again furthered to





include literacy and numeracy through writing the alphabet and numbers on the coins. To extend this interest the Starfish and Lionfish have made their own pirate hats and maps which they used to find treasure. Starfish and Lionfish have also engaged in a walk the plank game.





Dramatic Play... The Starfish and Lionfish have been observed expressing their imagination and creativity through the means of dramatic play. While inside we have had countless picnics and dinner parties.





While outside the trolleys and dolls have been requested. The Starfish and

Lionfish have also pretended to be doctors and dentists using the doctors and dentists' kits.



Gross Motor Activities... The Starfish and Lionfish have expressed an interest in gross motor activities which was furthered through our news topic. The Starfish and Lionfish have collaborated to create their obstacle course using a variety of resources such as hula hoops, tunnels, stepping stones and balancing beams. The Starfish and Lionfish have also engaged



in various ball games such as soccer, basketball and ball and bat games.



Ooshies... This month the Starfish and Lionfish have been sharing the ooshies they have collected for news. This has led to countless discussions in relation to what ooshies they have, which ones they want and why they like them. We have



researched the collection using ipads and the prowise board. To further this, we have researched

the different types of ooshies and completed simple experiments using them. For example, seeing if they glow in the dark and how they change in water.



Puzzles... Throughout September the Starfish and Lionfish have requested various puzzles. Once out the Starfish and Lionfish have been observed collaborating to complete the puzzle as they engaged various problem-solving







techniques. Once done proudly showing peers and educators. Favourite puzzle being the Paw Patrol puzzle and then the princess and jungle animal puzzle.
