The interest came from when the children requested to read and listen to the book every time we had chances. Finally, it is the final months of the year! Welcome to Jellyfish November & December newsletter. We would like to thank all families and pumpkin educators that have been working together in sharing and exchanging information about each child's development. We would say it has been the drive to all our curriculum planning cycles. This month, our Jellyfish explorers have been busy exploring and investigating various play-based experience originated from family input, also their own interests. In particular, we have also been focusing closely on senior Jellyfish who have turned 3 years old for having a smooth transition to preschool room early next year. We talked about name writing, independency, toileting, self-help skills, and changes that are going to happen in the big room!



Little artists

At the beginning of the month, Jellyfish children were extremely excited participating in various creative arts activities such as drawing, dancing, singing, creating, and more creative experiences. Jellyfish educators responded to all children's strengths, interests, and abilities positively by ensuring their pride and achievement are acknowledged and displayed. We have decided to display all their art work at the room, please find your child's name on the wall and observing their creative expression and stories. One of the highlight of the creative experience is when Miss Sisilia (workplacement student) who is great in playing guitar leading us well with various nursery rhymes that children love! The music experience really enabled children to share happiness and enjoyment through songs and rhymes.

Bushfire



The bushfire learning and discussion occurred as one child showed curiosity and contributed his knowledge during group play experience "Do you know, Miss Stella? I see smoke that caused by the bushfire when I drive pass" Observing the interest, Miss Stella decided to get the group gather and talked about the weather yesterday, also how it relates to the bushfire that that child

mentioned before. Miss Stella then decided to print out some images and did some research to further children's wonder and interest. During the conversation, one child also showed their knowledge about our natural habitat and commented, "Do you know Miss Stella the fire is coming to the ocean and all fishes are dying" the discussion went deeper as Miss Stella talked about the 'Koala rescue', how some koala perished in the forest because of it. Jellyfish used reflective thinking to consider why things happen and what can be learnt from these experiences. We believe children as an active agent that have significant roles to be part of building sustainable future for the world. To further the investigation, Miss Stella provided children some paper, paint colours (red, yellow, and orange), and some paint brushes to broaden their understanding about the world they are live in, also transferring knowledge from one setting to another.

'Letter to Santa'




Approaching one of the most anticipated event of the year, Jellyfish children have been showing awareness by expressing various thoughts and expression observing at the centre decoration. One

day, one of the children in the room brought in a Christmas stories where children were

introduced to the traditional Christmas elements and stories. Upon the positive responses from the children, children and educators worked together making our own Santa mailbox pretending that we would send letters to Santa telling him what are their wishes for Christmas. Throughout the experiences,





putting the letter card to the box while expressing what they wanted. For instance, "I want piano!"; "I want yoyo!"; "I want candies!"; or "I want Thomas the train"; and more! Observing it, Jellyfish educators continuously planned for time and space where children can reflect on their play experience and learning and encourage them to see similarities and connections between them. Jellyfish children and educators also involved in several cooking experiences making Christmas tree with ice-

cream cones, also Christmas cupcakes! It has been an experience that have created enjoyable opportunities for life-learning and encouraging children to be involved in their own learning while using their sensory capabilities.

In the last week of November, we had another four-legged visitor- Fluffy (A dog of one of our Starfish friends). 
Once finished the Starfish were once again provided with opportunity to pat Fluffy.



Dancing... While outside the Starfish have requested to have music put on. Once the music was on the Starfish commenced busting various dance moves individually and within groups. The Starfish also started to request



their favourite songs and were heard singing along. This interest in dancing lead to the Starfish frequently engaging in various games of musical statutes. The Starfish were lucky to join with one of our practical experience educators as she sang and played play guitar.



Obstacle Course... While outside this month the Starfish have collaborated and cooperated when using the stepping stones and balancing beams to create various different obstacles courses. When doing so discussing where the

them into the desired location. Once complete the Starfish demonstrated their prosocial behaviours as they lined up and took turns to move through the obstacle course.





Nature.... The natural environment was an interest for the Starfish through out November. Most days the Starfish express care for the environment as they assisted the educators to water the garden and sweep up the fallen leaves. The Starfish used their senses explore some of the plants and flowers we have growing in our environment. The Starfish also used magnifying glasses

to explore natural resources found as well as a bird's nest and a wasp nest.

The Starfish have spent a large amount of time collecting various

leaves and plants and added the grapefruit seed pods for extra



natural resources in particular the countless grapefruit seeds and leaves. The collected leaves were used to create a leaf collage as an idea from one of our children. As well as using the other natural resources within dramatic play and even made a salad using



flavour. One Starfish child brought in some rocks she collected on a family holiday. Through some research the Starfish learnt that this was a game where people would decorate rocks and hide them for other to find. The Starfish were excited to decorate their own rocks and invited families and friends to take a rock or two to hide for others to find. In late November the Starfish investigated the topic of drought





using the book Professor Cockatoos' Amazing Weather Dust. This laid the foundation for further discussion and research as to what is a drought and how

we can each do our part to save water. While outside the Starfish asked to create their own weather dust. The Starfish were seen each collected various item before adding them into the big dish.





Christmas... We got in the Christmas spirit very early this year. The Starfish brought in

various Christmas books to share as well as, requested Christmas books to be



read during group times. During meal times the Starfish have listened to various Christmas carols and even broke into song alongside their educatorsat various times. Together the Starfish have painted and decorated a recycled box Christmas tree and Santa's sleigh which will be used for our Christmas concert. The Starfish have engaged within various Christmas craft this including









(but not limited to) making baubles, wreaths, snowflakes and even their own Santa searchers. The Starfish have made their Christmas presents to their families (We won't say any more as it is a surprise!). While outside the Starfish have frequently requested to play the Grinch, who stole Christmas game. Which requires an educator to be the Grinch and find all the "presents" (typically Lego) which the Starfish have hid.



Literacy and Numeracy.... During the afternoons the Starfish educators have been encouraging the Starfish to challenge themselves in regards to literacy and numeracy. The Starfish have used writing cards to practise writing

different objects and animals. As well finding words beginning with particular letters in books and trying to write them. The Starfish have also requested to do letter sheet challenges. In addition to this the Starfish have been writing their first names, surnames and numbers. Some Starfish have also challenged



themselves to write their middle names, peers name and numbers beyond ten! While outside the Starfish frequently request the jumping game. The jumping game provides an







opportunity for the Starfish to practise their spelling and counting. It is great to see the Starfish requesting literacy and numeracy activities as well as the huge

improvement in their knowledge and abilities.
